It is that sense of our social selves that gave me the inspiration for this month's thoughts.

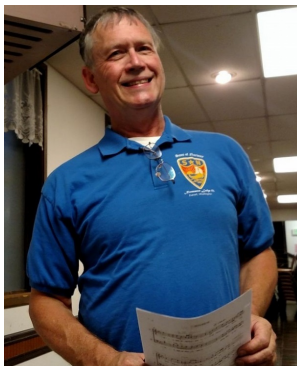

Normanna Sewing Club

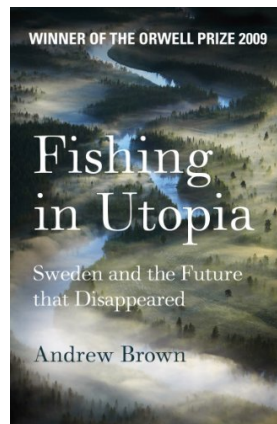

Fishing In Utopia: Sweden And The Future That Disappeared by Andrew Brown

From the 1960s to the 1980s, Sweden was an affluent, egalitarian country envied around the world. Refugees were welcomed, even misfit young Englishmen could find a place there. Andrew Brown spent part of his childhood in Sweden during the 1960s. In the 1970s he married a Swedish woman and worked in a timber mill while helping to raise their small son. The welfare system crumbled along with the industries that had supported it. 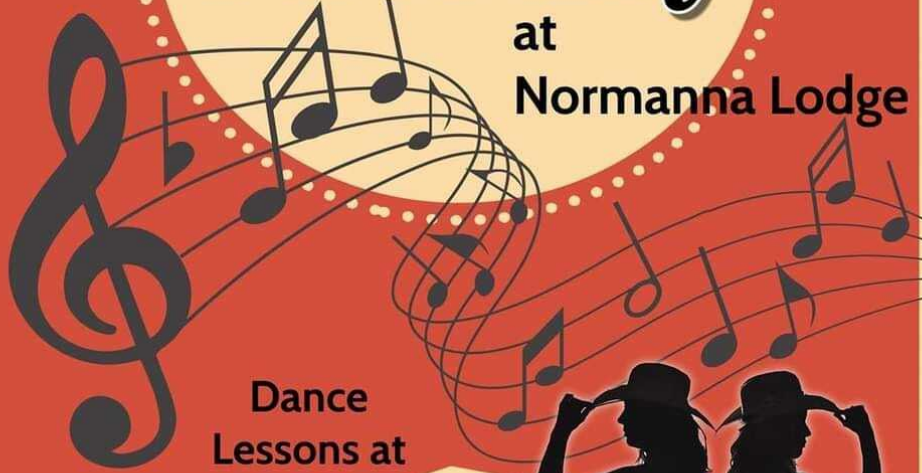
