
Hilsen fra Presidenten

Bowling is a fun game for everyone. I hope we can keep it going! We need people who like to have fun and keep our league going!





REPRINTED FROM NORMANNA NEWS, JULY 1992

In 1956 the Normanna Ladies Club contracted with my father, Alfred Halvorson, to paint three murals depicting scenes of Norway for the lodge.

It took several months to complete these paintings and I remember it well. I was only 13 years old and especially loved the picture of the girl and the goats.

Mary Melhaus was an officer of the club and came to the house several times to see the progress on the paintings. It was a sad day for us when they took the paintings out of our basement. Many people had come by to see them and it was a wonderful and proud day for me when the Lodge unveiled the pictures.

In appreciation, the Lodge made my father a Life Member. My father died in 1966 but the memories and painting will remain for a long time.
